

Marion County Local Mitigation Strategy

January 23, 2023

1) Marion County Local Mitigation Strategy & Five-Year Plan Update

- i. Marion County has adopted a Local Mitigation Strategy in accordance with the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000.
- ii. Chapter 44 CFR Sections 201 & 206 provide that local jurisdiction(s) must review and revise the local mitigation plan to reflect changes in development, progress in local mitigation efforts, and changes in priorities, and update the local mitigation plan a minimum of every five (5) years in order to continue to be eligible for Federal hazard mitigation funds under the Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA").
- iii. The LMS Five-Year Plan was updated in 2021. The LMS Plan Five-Year Update was approved by the Marion County Board of County Commissioners on May 4, 2021 by Resolution No. 21-R-214. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) granted formal approval of the document on July 28, 2021. It will expire on May 19, 2026. As an approved participating jurisdiction, the County is an eligible applicant for the following mitigation programs administered by FEMA: Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC), and Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA).
- iv. The LMS is coordinated by the Marion County Growth Services Department, 2710 E. Silver Springs Blvd., Ocala, FL 34470. Staff contact is Kenneth Odom, Transportation Planner.
- v. In accordance with the LMS by-laws, the strategy is guided by a local working group led by a Steering Committee containing representatives from Marion County, incorporated municipalities, key businesses, interest groups and citizens.

2) LMS Project List – “Mitigation Initiatives”

- i. The 2022 announcements notice for new project submittal were transmitted on July 25, 2022: Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Projects. The following new projects were ranked and added to the list:

 - vi. *Marion County Environmental Services: Oak Run 2 – Water Treatment Generator*
 - vii. *Marion County Environmental Services: Oak Trace – Water Treatment Generator*
 - viii. *Marion County Environmental Services: Majestic Oaks – Water Treatment Generator*
 - ix. *Marion County Environmental Services: Rainbow Lakes Estates – Water Treatment Generator*
 - x. *Marion County Environmental Services: Track & Card – water Treatment Generator*
- ii. One project reached the 5-year expiration window:
 - i. *Sateke Village HOA: Water Station Portable Generators*

3) Election of Officers

- i. On January 20, 2021, the LMS Steering Committee elected Erin Miller, Sheriff's Office Emergency Management Deputy Director as Chairman and Sean Lanier, Director, Office of City Engineer, City of Ocala as Vice Chairman. The LMS Steering Committee has opted to adopt a four-meeting per year schedule instead of a two-meeting per year schedule. The next scheduled meeting will be held in February 2023 where new officer elections will take place.

Resilient Florida Planning Grants are fully funded and have a 3-year performance period. 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

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

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
