Award Executive Summary

The FY2023 application is to request FY2023 Section 5307 funds apportioned to the Ocala UZA, FL in the amount of \$2,945,359 to cover capital and operating expenses for the provision of SunTran fixed-route service for the period from 10/01/2023 through 09/30/2028. The non-federal local share is \$563, 331 from the City of Ocala and Marion County. The State of Florida is providing \$456,118 in Toll Revenue Credits as the 20% match to the capital and operating match in the amount of \$557,556.

The application utilizes funding for capital and operating expenses for the provision of SunTran service as well as ADA paratransit services. The City expends operating and capital cost of contracting funds for its Type 1 Service Contract with RATP Dev. The operating assistance expenses were determined by reviewing NTD data, our Type 1 Service Contract with RATP Dev, and invoices or other records of payments for SunTran expenses organized by the Department's Fiscal Manager. Funding will also be used to rebuild four Gillig engines and transmissions and replacement of related mechanical parts. Upgrades and maintenance of our Avail Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) and 800 MHz radio system will also be funded by this grant. The SunTran ITS activities are in compliance with the City of Ocala's ITS plan.

The SunTran facility is located within the City of Ocala complex and is secured by the City. The City has included \$29,454 for a key card door locking system, an alarm system, security cameras, and additional lighting which satisfies the 1% security requirement.

The City of Ocala receives FTA 5307 funds through FDOT, in accordance with FTA procedures for urbanized areas with populations below 200,000. Matching local funds are from the City of Ocala and Marion County, Florida. FTA funds are also matched using State Transit Block Grant funds and toll revenue credits were used to match FTA funds for capital expenditures. The City of Ocala will follow all

3rd party procurement policies as defined in C4220.1F (Third Party Contracting Guidance). The City of Ocala will ensure contractors procured will not be on the FTA Suspension and Debarment list.

The budget for this grant includes an FTA allocation of \$2,945,359 state funding of \$557,556, local funding of \$563,331 and TDC funding of \$456,118.

Award Description

Purpose

The purpose of this award is to provide capital and operating funding for Ocala's fixed route bus service, SunTran.

Activities to be performed:

The funding will cover capital and operating expenses for the provision of SunTran fixed-route service for the period from 10/01/2023 through 09/30/2028. This grant will cover: (1) rebuilding 3 Gillig Buses engines and transmissions and mechanical related items; (2) contract maintenance of SunTran's Avail

Intelligent Transportation System and 800 MHz radio system; (3) funding to cover the capital cost of contracting to ensure that SunTran continues to be maintained at a level necessary to operate a high-quality system for our riders; (4) ADA paratransit service and operating assistance so that we may continue to serve the riding public; and (5) operating expenses that support the function of the SunTran system.

The City of Ocala receives FTA 5307 funds through FDOT, in accordance with FTA procedures for urbanized areas with populations below 200,000. Matching local funds are from the City of Ocala and Marion County, Florida. FTA funds are also matched using State Transit Block Grant funds and toll revenue credits were used to match FTA funds for capital expenditures. The City of Ocala will follow all 3rd party procurement policies as defined in C4220.1F (Third Party Contracting Guidance). The City of Ocala will ensure contractors procured will not be on the FTA Suspension and Debarment list.

Funding will permit SunTran to make necessary capital improvements to its bus fleet; maintain its ITS and radio systems; and continue to provide ADA paratransit service. It will also cover the capital cost of contracting and operating expenses.

The citizens of Ocala / Marion County who utilize the bus services will benefit from the improvements and funding to continue the operation of the buses.

Project Description

Operating and Capital funds will be used to cover the operational portion of Sun Tran's fixed route services provided by RATP Dev USA beginning August 1, 2024 through July 31,2029. It will also pay for other operational expenses such as, but not limited to: staff salaries working on SunTran related activities and grants; fuel for the buses; utilities; phone services; maintenance of the SunTran facility; software and equipment necessary for the operation of SunTran; training of staff; and operating supplies.

Capital activities within this application include: rebuilding engines and transmissions for three (3) 35 foot diesel buses; purchasing shop equipment and refurbish parallelogram lift; maintaining the ITS communications and radio communications systems; and paying for the capital cost of contracting with the current contractor, RATP Dev.

The design and engineering of the kiosk/bathroom facility to be located at the bus transfer station was paid via a FDOT PTGA contract, #G2215. This PTGA contract ends June 30, 2024. The contract with Kimley-Horn, who was hired to do design and engineering of the building included construction management services for the kiosk/restroom building. The construction of the facility will be paid via FTA Consolidate Capital Grant, FL-2024-023-00. This grant will pay for the construction management services, which amounts to \$42,663.

This is a Section 5307 Operating and Capital Assistance grant application for fiscal year FY 2023. The total amount applied for within this project is (\$2,709,731) representing the 5307 funds available for FY 2023. The match for the Non-Federal share (20%) will come from State of Florida Department of Transportation toll revenue credits in the amount of (\$456,118). The funds will allow the City of Ocala to complete operating and capital assistance projects within the small, urbanized area of Marion County that will enhance and improve service efficiency as well as safety and security for SunTran's riding public and staff. As required under Section 5307 for funds apportioned, the City of Ocala we will apply 1% of these funds to public transportation security projects. The security projects are aligned with ALI 11.32.07 at a total cost of \$23,563.

Award Executive Summary: The FY2023 application is to request FY2023 Section 5307 funds apportioned to the Ocala UZA, FL in the amount of \$2,945,359 to cover capital and operating expenses for the provision of SunTran fixed-route service for the period from 10/01/2023 through 09/30/2028. The non-federal local share is \$563,331 from the City of Ocala and Marion County. The State of Florida is providing \$456,118 in Toll Revenue Credits as the 20% match to the capital and operating match in the amount of \$557,556.

The application utilizes funding for capital and operating expenses for the provision of SunTran service as well as ADA paratransit services. The City expends operating and capital cost of contracting funds for its Type 1 Service Contract with RATP Dev. The operating assistance expenses were determined by reviewing NTD data, our Type 1 Service Contract with RATP Dev, and invoices or other records of payments for SunTran expenses organized by the Department's Fiscal Manager. Funding will also be used to rebuild four Gillig engines and transmissions and replacement of related mechanical parts. Upgrades and maintenance of our Avail Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) and 800 MHz radio system will also be funded by this grant. The SunTran ITS activities are in compliance with the City of Ocala's ITS plan.

The SunTran facility is located within the City of Ocala complex and is secured by the City. The City has included \$29,454 for a key card door locking system, an alarm system, security cameras, and additional lighting which satisfies the 1% security requirement.

The City of Ocala receives FTA 5307 funds through FDOT, in accordance with FTA procedures for urbanized areas with populations below 200,000. Matching local funds are from the City of Ocala and Marion County, Florida. FTA funds are also matched using State Transit Block Grant funds and toll revenue credits were used to match FTA funds for capital expenditures. The City of Ocala will follow all 3rd party procurement policies as defined in C4220.1F (Third Party Contracting Guidance). The City of Ocala will ensure contractors procured will not be on the FTA Suspension and Debarment list.

The budget for this grant includes an FTA allocation of \$2,945,359 state funding of \$557,556, local funding of \$563,331 and TDC funding of \$456,118.
