

**FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE WOOD POLE INSPECTION AND  
GROUNDLINE TREATMENT "PIGGYBACK" OFF OF PREVIOUS AGREEMENT WITH SEPARATE  
GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY**

THIS FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT TO PROVIDE WOOD POLE INSPECTION AND GROUNDLINE TREATMENT "PIGGYBACK" OFF OF PREVIOUS AGREEMENT WITH SEPARATE GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY ("Fourth Amendment") is entered into by and between **CITY OF OCALA**, a Florida municipal corporation ("City"), and **OSMOSE UTILITIES SERVICES, INC.**, a corporation duly organized in the state of Delaware and authorized to do business in the state of Florida (EIN# 35-2175310) ("Vendor").

**WHEREAS**, on February 7, 2017, City and Vendor entered into an Agreement to Provide Wood Pole Inspection and Groundline Treatment "Piggyback" off of Previous Agreement with Separate Governmental Entity (the "Original Agreement") for a term commencing February 7, 2017 through September 30, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 21, 2019, City and Vendor entered into a First Amendment of Agreement to Provide Wood Pole Inspection and Groundline Treatment "Piggyback" off of Previous Agreement with Separate Governmental Entity (the "First Amendment") to modify the purchase price under the Original Agreement and replace Exhibit B – Price Proposal with Exhibit B – 2019 Price Proposal; and

**WHEREAS**, on July 30, 2021, City and Vendor entered into a Second Amendment to Agreement to Provide Wood Pole Inspection and Groundline Treatment "Piggyback" off of Previous Agreement with Separate Governmental Entity (the "Second Amendment") to extend the Original Agreement, as amended, for the first of two, two-year renewal periods from October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2022, and to modify the purchase price under the Original Agreement and replace Exhibit B – 2019 Price Proposal with Exhibit B – Pricing Proposal FY 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 4, 2022, City and Vendor entered into a Third Amendment to Agreement to Provide Wood Pole Inspection and Groundline Treatment "Piggyback" off of Previous Agreement with Separate Governmental Entity (the "Third Amendment") to modify the purchase price under the Original Agreement, as amended, and replace Exhibit B – Pricing Proposal FY 2021 with Exhibit B – Pricing Proposal FY 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, City and Vendor wish to extend the Original Agreement, as amended, for the final two-year renewal period available under the Original Agreement and to amend the pricing schedule for the 2023 fiscal year.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of each of the foregoing recitals and the following mutual covenants, conditions and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby mutually acknowledged, City and Vendor agree as follows:

1. **RECITALS.** City and Vendor hereby represent and warrant that the Recitals set forth above are true and correct.
2. **INCORPORATION OF ORIGINAL AGREEMENT.** The Original Agreement, as amended, between City and Vendor is hereby incorporated by reference as if set forth herein in its entirety and remains in full force and effect, except for those terms and conditions expressly amended by this Fourth Amendment.

3. **RENEWAL TERM.** The Original Agreement is hereby renewed for the final two year (2-year) term beginning **OCTOBER 1, 2022** and terminating on **SEPTEMBER 30, 2024**.
4. **AMENDMENT TO EXHIBIT B – PRICE PROPOSAL.** The document attached to the Original Agreement, as amended, as Exhibit B – Pricing Proposal FY 2021 is hereby deleted and replaced, in its entirety, with the document attached to this First Amendment as **Amended Exhibit B – Price Proposal FY 2023**. This revised pricing shall be in effect from **OCTOBER 1, 2022** through **SEPTEMBER 30, 2023**.

The annual contract expenditure for services shall not exceed **\$200,000 (TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS)**. A Contract year runs from October through September. Adjustments to the compensation may be requested by Vendor at least sixty (60) calendar days prior to the anniversary date of this Agreement each year. Price changes must be agreed to by the City of Ocala, or the agreement shall terminate at the end of the anniversary year. Any negotiated price changes shall become effective on the anniversary date of that calendar year. Vendor shall provide documentation for any such price increase and the price increase shall not exceed the Consumer's Price Index (CPI) during the previous twelve calendar months as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics.

5. **NOTICES.** All notices, certifications or communications required by this Fourth Amendment shall be given in writing and shall be deemed delivered when personally served, or when received if by facsimile transmission with a confirming copy mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested. Notices can be concurrently delivered by email. All notices shall be addressed to the respective parties as follows:

8. **LEGAL AUTHORITY.** Each person signing this Fourth Amendment on behalf of either party individually warrants that he or she has full legal power to execute this Fourth Amendment on behalf of the party for whom he or she is signing, and to bind and obligate such party with respect to all provisions contained in this Fourth Amendment.

We have attached the April "Table 3. Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U): U.S. city average, special aggregate indexes (Services)," for your reference.

**Private Property:** The Private Property rate will be applied when a crew attempts to access a pole that cannot be reached due to homeowner/business access restrictions or limitations.

**Groundwire Repair:** Please note, the groundwire repair item listed on the price schedule will be made from the groundline to a distance as high as Osmose field technicians can reasonably reach from the ground (typically 7'-0" to 8'-0").

**GPS Data:** The GPS data (per structure) item includes a GPS point with an accuracy level of one to ten meters (1-10 meters). One attempt will be made to collect the GPS point. Osmose will not charge for any unattainable data collection. If requested however, Osmose field technicians can return to any pole location, for an hourly rate, to recollect data.

**Digital Image:** One attempt will be made to collect the Digital Image. Customer understands that weather, vegetation, and physical obstructions may restrict the ability to capture the digital images.
