STAFF RECOMMENDATION (Motion Ready): Approve Agenda Item (ID # 16126) renewal of a five-year agreement with Marion County for the disposal of the City's household hazardous and electronic waste items with a total contract value of \$123,250.65

OCALA'S RELEVANT STRATEGIC GOALS: Quality of Place

BACKGROUND:

This inter-local agreement allows for residents of the City of Ocala to dispose of household hazardous and electronic waste at no charge. City residents can dispose of these items at any of the Marion County disposal sites, or at either of the two (2) collection events (electronic only) held at the SW corner of NE 14th Street & NE Eighth Avenue throughout the year.

The City was able to negotiate a flat fee of \$24,650.13 per year with the County, regardless of the amount collected. The previous contract's price was \$17,002.44 per year. The five-year contract expenditure is \$123,250.65, up from the previous contract's expenditure of \$85,012.20. This is an increase of 44.98% from the previous contract amount.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS:

Disposal of household hazardous and electronic waste is vital to maintaining a clean and safe environment. This agreement allows City residents the opportunity to dispose of these items throughout the year in addition to the City's two annual amnesty events, that provide safe disposal and reduce the amount of improperly placed items in their household garbage for disposal.

Staff recommends Council approve the five year contract with Marion County to provide a valuable household hazardous and electronic waste service to our citizens.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funding for this contract has been budgeted in 453-023-326-534-53-34010 for FY21-22 in the amount of \$24,650.13 and will be budgeted for FY22-23 through FY25-26 in the amount of \$24,650.13. The agreement provides for potential Consumer Price Index (CPI) yearly increases tied to the CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U).
