

**THIRD AMENDMENT TO THE CONTRACT BETWEEN  
THE CITY OF GAINESVILLE d/b/a GAINESVILLE REGIONAL UTILITIES, AND  
OSMOSE UTILITIES SERVICES, INC.  
FOR WOOD POLE INSPECTION AND GROUNDLINE TREATMENT**

**THIS THIRD AMENDMENT** is made and entered into with an effective date of October 1, 2022, by and between the CITY OF GAINESVILLE, a Florida municipal corporation d/b/a GAINESVILLE REGIONAL UTILITIES ("GRU"), with offices located at 301 S.E. 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Gainesville, Florida 32601 and OSMOSE UTILITIES SERVICES, INC. ("CONTRACTOR"), a Delaware corporation, with its principal place of business at 635 Highway 74 South, Peachtree City, Georgia 30269, individually referred to as "Party" or collectively as "Parties."

**WHEREAS**, the Parties entered into a contract on October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016, which included the Contract and Attachment 1 - General Terms and Conditions, Attachment 2 - Supplemental Conditions, Attachment 3 - Technical Specifications and Attachment 4 - Pricing (together the "Initial Contract") with a termination date of September 30, 2020, for wood pole inspection and groundline treatment; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parties agreed that the Initial Contract may be extended for two (2) two-year extensions, upon mutual agreement of the Parties; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parties entered into a First Amendment on October 1, 2020 whereby the Parties extended the Initial Contract for two years, through September 30, 2022, and agreed to a pricing adjustment, followed by a Second Amendment on October 1, 2021 whereby the Parties agreed to an additional pricing adjustment; and

**WHEREAS**, the Parties have agreed to extend the Initial Contract for the second and final two year period, through September 30, 2024, and also agreed to a pricing adjustment.


**NOW, THEREFORE**, in consideration of the foregoing premises and the covenants contained herein, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The term of the Initial Contract is extended for a period of two (2) years, through September 30, 2024.
2. Attachment 4 of the Initial Contract is amended and restated and is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A. The new prices in Exhibit A supersede the prices in the Second Amendment.
3. Contractor shall continue to provide pole inspection and groundline treatment in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Initial Contract and updated pricing attached hereto.
4. Except as modified herein, all terms and conditions of the Initial Contract, First Amendment and Second Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
