Bill M., Representing the Applicant, stated he is available for questions.

Council Member Hilty read an email he received from a concerned citizen regarding the requested zoning. The applicant is requesting a zoning change to avoid the existing setback requirements.

Ms. Johnson confirmed US Highway 27 has setback requirements. The R-3 zoning district has different buffering requirements compared to single-family residential. Furthermore, the address assignment will be given during site development.

Bill M. confirmed they never applied for a special exception from the Board of Adjustment with Pro Tem Dreyer. Furthermore, the front of the development will face US Highway 27, to make use of the crossover access.

Council Member Bethea expressed concern regarding pedestrian safety.

City Manager Pete Lee spoke on the development options.

Planning Director Aubrey Hale explained how a special exception granted by the Board of Adjustment has time restrictions for the development to take place.

Pro Tem Dreyer suggested proceeding with a special exception.

Bill M. spoke on the 13-unit conceptual plan.

Mr. Hale noted the site has development limitations.

Mr. Lee suggested Council consider if the zoning is appropriate. To note, Council has more control over B-4 zoning compared to R-3 zoning.

Growth Management Director Tye Chighizola spoke in support of R-3 zoning. The surrounding area has residential uses.

Mr. Lee suggested the buildings face south to support surrounding residential uses.

Mr. Hale confirmed the B-4 allows for a special exception.

Pro Tem Dreyer noted the parcel is heavily surrounded by commercial uses.

Attorney Sexton stated Council is concerned regarding transportation and zoning compatibility.

Council Bethea expressed concern regarding traffic impacts.
